El Estado de Hidalgo recognizes and enhances the life of one of the proceres by exalting the life and achievements of a prominent man, Jie and Colonel Juan C. Doria Gzz. Whose political capacity, with only 30 years of age, led him to become, at the suggestion of the Benemerito de las Americas, Don Benito, Juarez, the first Governor (provisional) of Hidalgo State, earning with his appointment and during his mandate the respect and appreciation of the population.

It was at the session of the town hall of the general congress on January 20, 1869, that the executive was appointed as Governor.

The Governor, despite knowing that his position would be for a short time, put the maximum effort in his mandate, again demonstrating a total commitment to the activity he was developing. Again the good response of the people did not wait, as can be seen in the following lines written on February 19, 1869: "the activity and energy displayed by General Doria in Pachuca against rebels and thieves, are objects of great praise and its conduct deserves to be recommended to other public officials who are in the same case, because it would be a very effective means to restore peace and security everywhere. "

Accustomed to the discipline, Colonel Doria placed special emphasis on fighting offenders, asking Preasidente Juarez for more security and equipment for the troops that guarded the security of the population.

La Fiesta de la Raza en Tijuana, Baja Cal.

Fue representado el opusculo historico "Colon", del Lic. Gorostieta

TIJUANA, Baja California, octubre 21.--En el salon de actos municipales de esta poblacion se efectuó una velada literario-musical, para celebrar el 427o. aniversario del descubrimiento de America. Fue el progresista Profesor, Sr. Dn. Manuel M. Doria. director de la Escuela Oficial de esta poblacion quien organizó esta fiesta, por acuerdo del Sr. Gobernador y con la cooperacion de las autoridades militares y civiles de Tijuana.

Los aplausos del numeroso publico que ocupaba el salon a las personas que tomaron parte en los diversos numeros del programa demostraron el grado con que fue recibido este homenaje al insigne descubridor.

El señor Ing. Rafael M. Tello, tuvo a su cargo el discurso oficial, desarrollo con habilidad el tema, haciendo referencia a la situación del mundo occidental en el siglo XV, a las ideas filosóficas y científicas que prevalecían en aquella época entre los elementos universitarios y los intelectuales, todas contrarias a las teorías que el ilustre genoves pretendía demostrar. Lo siguió en su peregrinación por las Cortes de la Europa Meridional solicitando ayuda pecuniaria y apoyo moral hasta lograrlos de la reina Isabel de Castilla, y describió su viaje y su llegada a la Isla de Guanahani. Hizo notar la influencia del descubrimiento en la evolución de la civilización europea y su efecto en la modificación de las tendencias de los europeos.

Un grupo de jóvenes y señoritas de la localidad llevó a la escena el opusculo dramático histórico "Colon" del Lic. Enrique Gorostieta. El primer cuadro se desarrolla a bordo de la "Santa María" el 11 de Octubre de 1492. La tripulación encabezada por un marinero (Sr. Enrique Romero) manifiesta su descontento y se niega a continuar el atrevido viaje hacia el Oeste, tratándolo asesinar al Almirante para poderlo hacer. El Contramaestre (Sr. Manuel Legrand) toma la defensa del genoves, y logra que los conjurados difieran por un día el cumplimiento de sus amenazas.

Colon (Sr. Juan M. Doria) ve con tristeza que su genial empresa está a punto de perderse, lamenta esto más que el peligro que tiene de perder la vida, pero no pierde la esperanza. Su genio (Srita. María Amparo Villaescusa), lo anima y cuando termina el plazo logrado por el contramaestre los conspiradores están a punto de llevar a cabo sus siniestros propósitos, pero la voz de "tierra" da por el vigía de la carabela, hace cambiar la situación.

El 2o. cuando representa el desembarque en la Isla de Guanahani, el Almirante empuña el estandarte de la Cruz y el contramaestre, el de Castilla, y en nombre de los Reyes Católicos se toma posesión de la nueva tierra y del mar que la baña. Los genios de América (Srita. Victoria Villaescusa) y de Guanahani (Srita. Trinidad Romero) dan la bienvenida al Almirante y en unión de todos entonan un himno acontecimiento.

Un cuadro plástico en el que toman parte todos los actores del cuadro, y una poesía dicha con maestría por la Señorita María Doria, siguió a la pieza referida que fue recompensada con aplausos.

Las decoraciones fueron pintadas por el Sr. Saenz, Profesor de Dibujo de la escuela, y fueron muy gustadas por el público especialmente la del paisaje de la Isla, que tenía hermoso efecto.

El Director de escena, Sr. Prof. Alberto Morales es digno de aplausos por la propiedad con que montó el espectáculo y por su excelente dirección artística.

La Composición "América," leída por el Sr. Profesor I. Navarro, fue oída con agrado y la niña Silvia Picker lució sus habilidades coreográficas en un hermoso bailable que mereció la repetición.

Puede decirse que esta fiesta tuvo un éxito que debe satisfacer a sus infatigables organizadores, y a las personas que en ella tomaron parte.

The Fiesta de la Raza in Tijuana, Baja Cal.

The historical booklet "Colon", by Lic. Gorostieta was represented

TIJUANA, Baja California, October 21 .-- A literary-musical evening was held in the municipal assembly hall of this town, to celebrate the 427th. anniversary of the discovery of America. It was the progressive Professor, Mr. Dn. Manuel M. Doria. Director of the Official School of this town who organized this party, by agreement of the Governor and with the cooperation of the military and civil authorities of Tijuana.

The applause of the large public that occupied the room to the people who took part in the various numbers of the program demonstrated the degree to which this tribute to the distinguished discoverer was received.

Mr. Ing. Rafael M. Tello, was in charge of the official speech, skillfully developing the subject, making reference to the situation of the western world in the fifteenth century, to the philosophical and scientific ideas that prevailed at that time among the elements University students and intellectuals, all contrary to the theories that the illustrious Genoves tried to demonstrate. She followed him on his pilgrimage through the Courts of Southern Europe requesting pecuniary aid and moral support until he obtained them from Queen Elizabeth of Castile, and described his travel and arrival on the Island of Guanahani. He noted the influence of discovery on the evolution of European civilization and its effect on changing the trends of Europeans.

A group of young men and women from the town brought to the scene the historical dramatic booklet "Colon" by Lic. Enrique Gorostieta. The first painting takes place on board the "Santa María" on October 11, 1492. The crew headed by a sailor (Mr. Enrique Romero) manifests his misdemeanor

and refuses to continue the daring journey to the West, trying to assassinate the Admiral to be able to do it. The Petty Officer (Mr. Manuel Legrand) takes the defense of the Genoves, and makes the conspirators defer by one day the fulfillment of their threats.

Colon (Mr. Juan M. Doria) sadly sees that his brilliant company is about to be lost, he regrets this more than the danger he has of losing his life, but he does not lose hope. His genius (Miss Maria Amparo Villaescusa) encourages him and when the term achieved by the boatswain ends, the conspirators are about to carry out their sinister purposes, but the "land" voice gives for the watch of the caravel, makes the situation change.

The 2nd. When he represents the landing on the Island of Guanahani, the Admiral holds the standard of the Cross and the boatswain, that of Castile, and in the name of the Catholic Monarchs takes possession of the new land and the sea that bathes it. The geniuses of America (Miss. Victoria Villaescusa) and Guanahani (Miss. Trinidad Romero) welcome the Admiral and together they all sing a hymn event.

A plastic painting in which all the actors in the painting take part, and a poetry masterfully written by Senorita Maria Doria, followed the aforementioned piece which was rewarded with applause.

The decorations were painted by Mr. Saenz, Drawing Teacher of the school, and were very liked by the public, especially the one of the landscape of the Island, which had a beautiful effect.

The stage director, Mr. Prof. Alberto Morales, is applause for the property with which the show was staged and for his excellent artistic direction.

The Composition "America," read by Mr. Professor I. Navarro, was listened to with pleasure and the girl Silvia Picker showed off her choreographic skills in a beautiful dance that deserved repetition.

It can be said that this party was a success that must satisfy its tireless organizers, and the people who took part in it.

b) "From the royal family of Prince Felipe Andrea Doria, Genoa, Italy"

It looks like they moved to San Diego, CA sometime after Maria & Ramon were born, in the early 1900's. Maria and Ramon are probably the youngest, according to the 1920 census, this was 1917 for Manuel and 1918 for Maclovia. The photo taken of Manuel & Maclovia in 1919 (?) is stamped "Y. Shannon; San Diego." Not finding him on the 1933 directory of San Diego either (did find Alma, John N, and Manuel Jr).

"Prfr. Manuel Ma. Doria Gzz. was born in Linares NL EN 1854, son of Rafael Doria Mercado and his mother Ma. de los Dolores González In 1884 the prfr. Doria lived more than one hundred years of which he reached 65 to primary education. He arrived at the classrooms as a preceptor, was a shareholder and water community member of the "Rio Pablillos". On September 8, 1890, his certificate of educator is known. On January 3, 1903 he made a contract for 4 years, with Federico de la Garza, to work as a director at the Pedro Noriega school, concluding on September 12, 1904. On July 26, 1924, the mayor Joaquín L. Alanís certified that professor Manuel Ma. Doria served education for 46 years and gives him the title of "Educator and apostle of teaching".

On February 14, 1929 his lawful wife dies the teacher Maclovía de la Lata de Doria, director of school No. 1 of Linares. Then the prfr. Doria practiced as a teacher in Linares (1930-1932) and the last year, he was director, along with the prfr. Juan Montero, Escobedo School and Nervo. Then they would dissolve society and prfr. Doria moved to a house near the temple of the Lord of Mercy. On September 4, 1939, at the age of 75, she married Oralía Escobedo, originally from Ascensión, NL, daughter of Eleno Escobedo and Micaela Ruiz. His marriage was for separate assets. After 65 years as a teacher he died in Tijuana, Baja California on February 12, 1954, and was buried in the old "Francisco Candanosa" pantheon in Linares.

THE PRIMARY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL MANUEL MA. DORIA built by the State Government in 1951 (in the presence of Professor Doria celebrating its 97 years of life) being inaugurated by the constitutional governor c. Dr. Ignacio Morones Prieto (who as a child was a student of Professor DORIA) and the municipal president, c. Francisco Candanosa Alanís. The Professor died at 100 years old.

His children Manuel, Jose, Lindolfo, Dolores, Rita, Maria, Guadalupe, Raul and Ramon."

Deseo adquirir doce metros cuadrados de terreno en el panteon de esta Ciudad, con el objeto de erigir una pequena capilla sobre los restos de mi nunca bien llorada companera, cuya muerte tuve que lamentar en patria extrana.

Siendo escasos los recursos con que cuento para rendir ante postumo homenaje a la que fue noble esposa y madre modelo de virtudes y amor para mis hijos, me veo en la necesidad de acudir esa Honorable Corporacion para que cubra el valor de ese terreno se fija la cuota mas moderada que sea posible.

Para tal consideracion invoco mi largo perfodo de cuarenta y siete anos en las filas del Magisterio Nacional, desempenados con honradez y fervor circunstancia que me hace temer la certeza de no ver defraudadas mis esperanzas.

Hay sentimientos que el dolor mismo no permite exrernar ampliamente; para en nombre de ellos, bien interpretados por quienes llevan el corazon la nobleza y la generosidad, acudo a demandar esta gracia, que estoy seguro de ver cumplida dentro de mis aspiraciones.

I wish to acquire twelve square meters of land in the pantheon of this City, with the aim of erecting a small chapel on the remains of my never well cried companera, whose death I had to lament in a strange homeland.

Being scarce the resources with which I count to render before posthumous tribute to the one who was noble wife and model mother of virtues and love for my children, I see myself in the need to go that Honorable Corporation so that it covers the value of that land the more moderate fee that is possible.

For such consideration I invoke my long period of forty-seven years in the ranks of the National Magisterium, performing with honesty and fervent circumstance that makes me fear the certainty of not seeing my hopes disappointed.

There are feelings that pain itself does not allow to extend widely; for in their name, well interpreted by those who carry the heart of nobility and generosity, I come to demand this grace, which I am sure to see fulfilled within my aspirations.

With the highest esteem of my gratitude, I hope that the worthy Authority represented by an illustrious Body, will solve my request in a benevolent manner.

I protest to you, the testimony of my deep respect.

A deeply moving detail that shows the sympathies that Baja Californians feel in this corner of Mexico for the Hero of Peace, we consign it to: say that when the soldiers heard the praises that were lavished on the memory of General Diaz, they rested their weapons on a wall of the room where the commemorative ceremony was held, and, with tears filled eyes they broke into applause ...

Fragments of the young Doctor's speech come to us, which, we will say in passing, enjoys the sympathy of all the worthy people of these regions. But the speech fragments pass from mouth to mouth and are repeated in heated discussions when the Carrancistas try to argue the falsity of the Tijuana's doctor's assertions.

I escape from death Dr. Doria in California

The manned car went to the abyss, leaving unharmed

SAN DIEGO, Cal., February 21. -

The sensation of the accident suffered by Dr. Doria, a prestigious medical doctor from Baja California, on the way from Mexicali to this city, has caused deep sensation among Californians residing in this city.

Upon arrival in San Diego, Mr. Doria was the object of expressions of sympathy from his friends, who received him with enthusiasm, as he managed to escape death. According to the doctor, the events occurred as follows: He had left Mexicali, manning his car, heading to San Diego, when between El Centro and Campo he found another car that did not give timely notice by sounding the siren. As the road is very dangerous, and in many miles of extension you can hardly find a place for a car, and it is also full of curves, the Doctor's car collided with that of the American, who had not taken the precaution of announcing the danger. Doctor Doria was on the side of the precipice and the force of the crash threw him onto the road, pulling him out of the car. This happened in a miraculous way. The doctor managed to get out almost unscathed from the accident, while his machine rolled into the abyss and burned at the bottom of the ravine.

Mexican Refugee Here

Tells of His Flight and That of His Family

Compelled to flee from Mexico to escape, as he believes, execution at the hands of rebels, Dr. M. M. Doria, jr., who has an office at 2304 Menard street, fears his brother and father, who remained in the revolution-torn country to protect their estate, have been killed.

The last word Dr. Doria received from his father was on Nov. 25 last, and from his brother, Joseph [Jose], last September. These men are near Linares, in the State of Tamaulipas, where each owns a farm. The elder Doria has an estate of considerable dimension, according to the son in St. Louis.

Both brothers received professional education in St. Louis, Joseph, who is 29 years old, having been graduated about five years ago as a stationary engineer. Dr. Doria received his degree in medicine from St. Louis University in 1907. The men married sisters, the daughters of Louis Schulze of the Menard street address. Joseph married Miss Hattie Schulze and Dr. Doria Miss Mamie Schulze. Joseph

and his wife have a son and the other couple have two daughters.

Soon after their graduate both young men returned to Mexico to follow their professions. Dr. Doria settled in Villagran and soon was appointed Mayor of the town by the then President Diaz. For several months after the overthrow of Diaz by Madero, Dr. Doria continued to hold that office.

"In Mexico," said Dr. Doria, Friday, "there is only one way to keep at peace with the Government, and that is to support it. I spoke my mind; I criticized; I did not take an active part in politics, but merely voiced my opinions when they were sought.

"Then I lost my office. This action was followed quickly by threats from the rebels. In Mexico all who are not supporters of Huerta are rebels. They are of the Madero faction. I was told that if I did not immediately come out in the open and work for the rebel cause I would be killed. Then the rebels became bolder in their attitude of daring toward me, and in February, 1913, I sent my wife and two daughters who are 3 and 5 years old, to her father here.

"I thought I could remain through the revolution and protect my property in Villagran, but I reckoned erringly. I was informed my presence in Villagran no longer was desirable and that the sooner I departed, the better it would be for me. I departed immediately; that was last March; I abandoned all of my possessions, merely locked the doors of my home and my office and caught a train.

"I have been informed my home and all its contents have been burned, the despoilers first taking such things of value as caught their fancy. During my administration as Mayor, the town hall of Villagran was remodeled and enlarged. I was very proud of that. But the rebels did not even spare city property; it was also looted and burned.

"I fear greatly that my father and brother have been killed. Such terrible and bold things are being done in Mexico. After the long silence, I could bear it no longer and last week wrote to Charge d'Affaires O'Shaughnessy for information regarding my relatives, but have had no reply." -- St. Louis Times.

Bars three before the police can stop him

SAN DIEGO, February 2. Last night, pedestrians and nearby residents were terrified for half an hour when Alejandro Ortega, a Mexican, brandishing a banana knife, fled and attacked three men before he was overpowered and handcuffed by two policemen, assisted by various citizens.

The Mexican had been acting strangely for several days and when Dr. M. M. Doria called the man's house to give him treatment, he was attacked by Ortega. The doctor fled, as did several passers-by, when the Mexican ran out of the house with the knife. Ortega broke the glass in Dr. Doria's limousine and was proceeding to destroy another machine when the police arrived.

The doctor, a pedestrian and one of the policemen were seriously injured during the hand-to-hand combat.

California's Epidemic is Ceding

Los Angeles, California, October 23. - Spanish influenza decreases very quickly in this city and throughout the State of California, according to information provided to the press by the State Health Council.

The measures that were taken, and the help that California families have voluntarily provided taking care of the disease, have been the two main factors that served to stop the plague that threatened to cause thousands of victims.

The epidemic is rapidly decreasing in this city and in the rest of California, and the cases of complete cures of influenza are increasing to those previously noted.

It is believed that the consumption of medicines by the inhabitants of California to take condoms against evil, has been greater than ever and it was even possible to ensure that there has been no one who does not consider it an inescapable duty to take them home or to the office where works, disinfectants or drinks prescribed by doctors in the newspapers.

Until today it is known that two families of the best known have been attacked in this city. Mr. Lic. Justo Castillo, an official who was on a walk in this city from that of Mexicali, contracted the disease and was about to die. Completely restored, he left for Baja California.

Dr. Francisco Molina, from the town of Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico. He came to this city called by his relatives to attend to his five children attacked by the influenza epidemic.

Dr. Molina is the official doctor of the city of Tijuana. Today, Mr. Manuel M. Doria is in his position. that it has enacted energy provisions to stop a possible contagion in Tijuana from the entry of workers or employees living on the American side.

In Tijuana, as news reaches this city. Schools and meeting places have already been closed and such measures are being taken, not because there has been a single case of the epidemic, but to prevent it from spreading.

The Mexican authorities have agreed that an injection be given to every person who enters Mexico.

In other California cities, according to special statements that health bureaus have been publishing, the influenza epidemic is decreasing considerably.

Al salir rumbo a Linares el 6 de junio, mi programa era el de encerrarme en un cuarto del hotel para no ser visto, pues el contacto con las gentes podía conducir a entablar conversaciones políticas que se suelen convertir en debates apasionados y desagradables. When I left for Linares on June 6, my program was to lock myself in a hotel room so as not to be seen, since contact with people could lead to political conversations that often turn into passionate and unpleasant debates. This happened on the intense and hectic days when Don Francisco I. Madero made a triumphant journey from Piedras Negras to Mexico City, and there was no talk throughout the country but of the radical and absolute change of a government; and since I was defeated, the wisest thing to do was to fade into the gloom. Thank God, my soul was full of hopes and hopes, and it was enough for me to contemplate my girlfriend so that all my worries would dissipate. In it I took refuge as a dismantled boat takes refuge in a quiet and cozy bay.

During my preparatory studies, I had had José Noriega, Jesús Berlanga, Manuel María Doria, Francisco Buentello and other Linarenses with whom I lived fraternally in the classrooms of the Colegio Civil (in the city of Monterrey); but all of them had left their native land and for the same reason, he was not going to have the opportunity to make laughing evocations of the past. Ten years earlier, he had gone on a military excursion with the other schoolboys, to Linares; but since we had only stayed four days, the fugitive memories were lost in vague and imprecise mists. In these circumstances, what was indicated was to arrive as anonymous, as a stranger, to separate myself from all social treatment, a treatment that I did not need because the beloved woman was enough to fill my life.

No death certificate for Manuel. He must have been born and died before the 1910 census (26 April). Hattie, on census, is listed as the mother of 4, with 2 living. There is time for him to have been born premature and died between Glorita and Joseph as well as immediately after Joseph, before Ethel. Depending on gestation time, there is also time for him to have been born/died after Ethel or after Louis Manuel. However, that only works if he was born in Mexico and I don't know that they would bury him in St. Louis while Ethel is buried in Mexico; it would also add a pre-1910 child who died that we don't have a name for. Missouri required death certificates starting in 1910 so it is most likely he was born and died before this began and before the 1910 census. So my guess is that most of this likely took place in 1909, possibly into early 1910.
